NEW EXHIBITION

From December 4th our new exhibition will showcase a special project for the 110th anniversary of the Scarborough bombardment. Historian Dr. David Pendleton has been researching the ships sunk by German mines laid during the bombardment. Twenty ships and 135 sailors were lost just a mile off Cayton Bay. With help from the Scarborough Sub Aqua Club we will reveal new information about the wrecks. David has been to search archives in London to find the names of the crew members, some of whom came from Scandinavia, Belgium, Holland, India and Arabia.

David will give a talk about his findings to the Scarborough Archaeological & Historical Society on the 16th of December at 7.30pm in the Salvation Army Hall in Scarborough. Entrance from 7pm, cost £3.

A film about the bombardment, including interviews with David Pendleton and SMHC volunteer, Stewart McDonald, will premiere at the Tees Valley International Festival in Stockton-on-Tees in November. It is hoped that there will also be a screening in Scarborough at some stage.


HERITAGE OPEN DAYS

FALMOUTH UK MARITIME HERITAGE CONFERENCE

SMHC volunteers, David Normandale & Mark Vesey, attended the UK Maritime Heritage Conference in Falmouth in October. Mark gave a report on our activities this year. Other presentations were by representatives from Glasgow, Exeter, London, Cromer, Portsmouth, Bristol & Chatham. The main topic was conservation of small historic boats, many of which are housed in Falmouth. Other presentations looked at historic vessels in danger of being scrapped due to financial restraints and a shortage of restoration and maintenance skills. Next year's conference will be held in Dundee.
